TRAINING PURPOSE

Speakers will share the latest information regarding vaccine administration, immunization schedules, vaccine storage and handling, HPV vaccine initiative, IRIS and TB. This event provides attendees an opportunity to receive current information on training topics and network with health care professionals.

OBJECTIVES

Attending the conference will enable the participant to do the following:

Vaccine schedule updates

Attendees will identify the following:

- Recommendations for the Meningitis B vaccination for adolescents and young adults for those aged 10 years and older at increased risk.
- Indications for newly licensed vaccines (Quadracel, Fluad)
- Appropriate intervals between doses of HPV9, licensure changes and use in males
- Appropriate intervals between doses of PCV13 and PPSV23
- Where to find resources for the most intricate vaccine recommendations (pneumococcal, meningococcal, DTaP, Hib)

TB program update

Attendees will identify the following:

- Difference between LTBI and TB disease
- Fundamental changes to testing requirements for health care workers in Iowa
- Use of rapid testing (NAA) for TB

HPV vaccine initiative

- Define the importance of HPV vaccination for cancer prevention and the rationale for vaccinating at ages 11 or 12
- List the recommendations for the HPV vaccine for girls and boys
- Provide useful and compelling information about the HPV vaccine to parents to aid in making the decision to vaccinate

IRIS update

Attendees will describe the following:

- New IRIS functionality, as well as provide feedback on suggested improvements
- How IRIS impacts the Vaccine for Children (VFC) program including inventory, vaccine ordering and provider profiles
- The process to initiate electronic data exchange between IRIS and an electronic health record system

Vaccine storage and handling

- Compare best practices to VFC requirements
- Discuss the benefits of digital data loggers in temperature monitoring
- Identify common vaccine storage and handling errors and how to respond to temperature excursions

Iowa Immunization Program updates

- Upcoming program requirements and activities
